A word from the CEO



Reflecting across the year

As we reflect on this year it has been deeply impactful and our team are immensely proud of what has been achieved over the course of 2022-2023.

We brought Shane Fitzsimmons AO to Adelaide to deliver the keynote at our Leadership in Times of Crisis event in his previous role as Commissioner of the New South Wales Rural Fire Service, Shane's insights, and reminders of the devastating consequences of bushfires and floods to communities and what resilience and leadership looks like during crisis times for our nation.

We ensured the Australian of the Year Dylan Alcott AO was able to engage with as many people in SA during his short visit. Dylan drove home to all of us in his address at the Australian of the Year Luncheon in conversation with Gill Hicks AM MBE,

the importance of eliminating the barriers of entry into the workplace for people living with disability. His advocacy has been powerful and has resonated with many employer and industry groups.

We delivered an outstanding Women in Space event with some of South Australia's leaders in this field sharing their stories and experiences and hopes for the space industry and the significant work that has been undertaken by women in SA. The event kicked off with some key reflections from Professor Tanya Monro AC. Her thoughtful and considered words were a key reminder of the importance of science to our world and how scientific endeavour continues to be a key driver of innovation.

We had the privilege of travelling into the regions in November to Port Lincoln, Whyalla, and Port Pirie where hundreds of community members and young people heard firsthand from our inspiring South Australians.

The year was also highlighted by the proclaiming of the South Australian of the Year event also in November with many outstanding people nominated. Four South Australians were selected; SA State Recipient Australian of the Year 2023 Taryn Brumfitt, SA State Recipient Senior Australian of the Year 2023 Sandra Miller, SA State Recipient Young Australian of the Year 2023 Awer Mabil and SA State Recipient Local Hero 2023 Christine Robertson. In January 2024 we were incredibly proud to hear that two of our South Australians of the Year were proclaimed as 2023 Australians of the Year again congratulations to Taryn Brumfitt 2023 Australian of the Year and Awer Mabile 2023 Young Australian of the Year.

It was a privilege to deliver The Uluru Statement from the Heart – A Deeper Understanding featuring keynote speaker Noel Pearson in May 2023. This was an extraordinary evening of inspiration as up to 1000 people gathered at the Adelaide Town Hall. It was an honour to have Noel Pearson, grace us with his profound wisdom and impassioned words. Noel's powerful address received a standing ovation and was followed by a rich and informative panel discussion comprising of Tanya Hosch, Commissioner for First Nations Voice Dale Agius and Arrin Hazelbane. We thank Noel Pearson, Annette Buckskin, Frank Wanganeen, Kirstie Parker our panellists Tanya Hosch, Dale Agius and Arrin Hazelbane for generously contributing to this deeply profound experience. We thank Gospo Collective for their stunning performance and thank the SA community for joining this invitation and being part of this once in a generation opportunity to fully realise the promise of the Uluru Statement.

ADCSA was honoured to present another incredible Australian of the Year Luncheon to a diverse audience of over 500 people at the Adelaide Convention Centre. This unforgettable experience featured South Australia's very own Taryn Brumfitt, founder of the Body Image Movement and the esteemed 2023 Australian of the Year. Accompanied by Amar Singh, the

Founder of Turbans 4 Australia and Local Hero 2023, their presence added immense value to the event. This luncheon also included a compelling panel discussion comprising of Paul Vasileff, Young Australian of the Year 2017, Sandra Miller, SA State Recipient Senior Australian of the Year 2023 and Christine Robertson OAM, SA State Recipient Local Hero 2023 and MC Jess Adamson. An integral part of the event was the opportunity for secondary school students and educators to interact with the speakers. Their engagement with these distinguished individuals helped inspire and guide them on their own journeys. The event's focus on student engagement provided a unique educational experience for the young attendees, exposing them to diverse perspectives and inspiring them to make a positive impact. The audience was also treated to exceptional performances by the Marryatville High School jazz ensemble, Folkwave Adelaide, Lloyd Williams St Peter's College, and the Dance Pad. These performances showcased the rich talent and diverse cultural elements of South Australia.

We can look back at our history, acknowledge the times we are now living through, and manifest our future on the foundations of respect, inclusivity, and shared values.

26 January 2023

Up to 3,500 people listened, learned, and paid their respects to our First Nations culture and communities by attending the Mourning in the Morning Smoking Ceremony. Attendees gathered from 7am on the morning of 26 January for a Smoking Ceremony at Tarntanya Wama (Elder Park). This profound ceremony shaped by First Nations leaders was a time for truth telling of our history and provided a genuine opportunity for reconciliation. The 26 January signifies the day the first fleet set foot on our shores – the day the lives of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities changed forever. We seek to reconcile the devastating impacts this brought to First Nations peoples. To the nation, we have become and the country we hope to be. This one-hour event opened with the Four Direction Ceremony presented by Uncle Moogy Sumner AM, followed by a powerful speaker's address presented by April Lawrie, Commissioner for Aboriginal Children and Young People, and mesmerising performances by the Iwiri Choir and Nancy Bates. The Mourning in the Morning – Smoking Ceremony was presented in partnership with the City of Adelaide, SA Power Networks and SARAH Constructions. It was assisted by the Australian Government through the National Australia Day Council and supported by the Government of South Australia.

Tindo Utpurndee – Sunset Ceremony

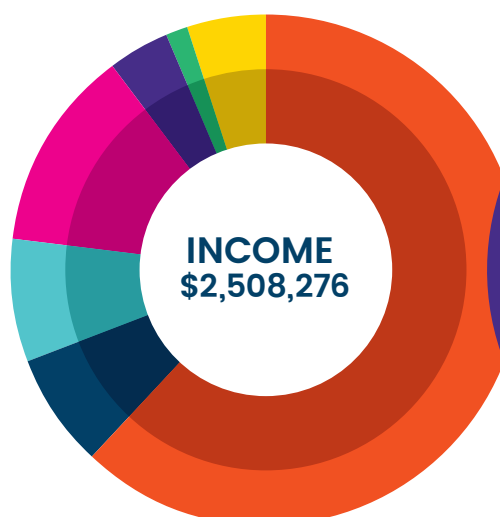

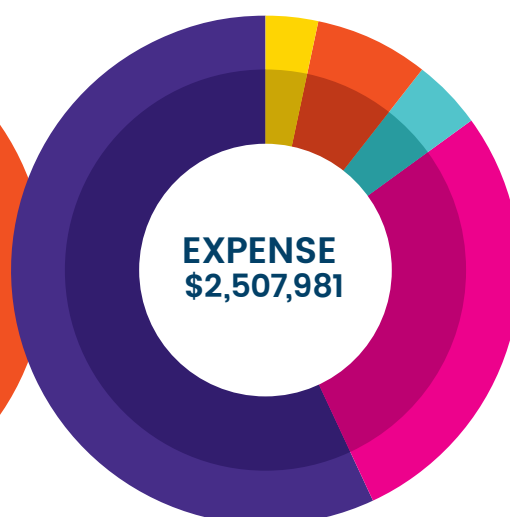
